

LESSON 19

Teacher Instructions

Read the words in **bold** out loud to your learner.

Today, you will learn about a new sound. Sometimes, letters work together to make one sound.

(point to *igh*)

These four letters, *e*, *i*, *g*, and *h*, work together to make the sound *igh*.

You hear the *igh* sound at the beginning of the word *eight*.

Say the word *eight*. What sound do you hear at the beginning? (pause for the student to answer)

That's right! *Eight* makes the *igh* sound.

Say the *igh* sound three times: *igh*, *igh*, *igh* (point to the *igh* each time)

(point to *igh*)

(point to *au*) These letters, *a* and *u*, work together to make the sound *au*.

You hear the *au* sound at the beginning of the word *August*. Say the *au* sound three times: *au*, *au*, *au* (point to the *au* each time)

(point to *aw*) These letters, *a* and *w*, work together to make the sound *aw*.

You hear the *aw* sound at the beginning of the word *awesome*. Say the *aw* sound three times: *aw*, *aw*, *aw* (point to the *aw* each time)

The word *height* is a memory word. That means it breaks the rules and you need to remember it.

(point to the *igh*)

The *igh* breaks the rules in this word. What sound does *igh* usually make? (pause for your student to answer)

That's right! *igh* usually makes the sound *igh* like the first sound in *eight*.

But in the word *height* the *igh* makes the sound *I*, like the first sound in *ice*.

Because it breaks the rules, you can remember the word *height*.

Read the word.
