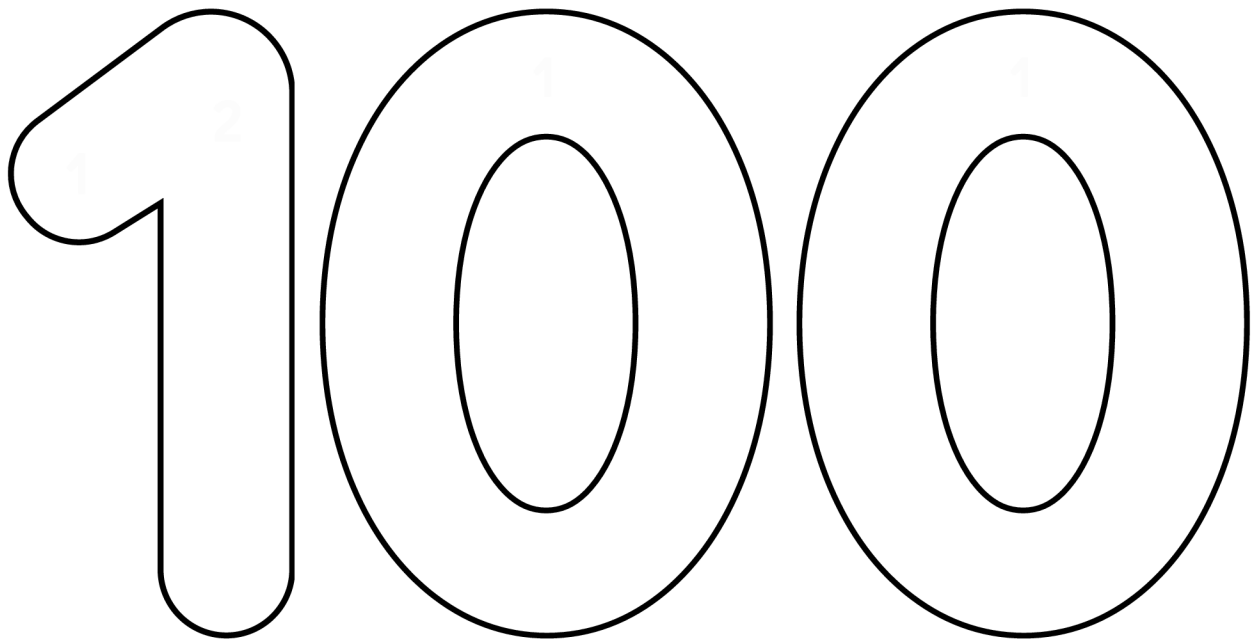


This is the number one hundred. Color the number.
