

LESSON 20

Teacher Instructions

Read the words in **bold** out loud to your learner.

Now we are going to learn another sound that *a* can make.

You already know that *a* can say *aaa* like in *apple* and *A* like in *made*.

But sometimes, *a* makes a different sound, like in *mama*, *papa*, and *father*.

In these words, *a* sounds like *ahhh* like the first sound in the word *awesome*.

(point to *ar*)

These two letters, *a* and *r*, work together to make the sound *ar*.

You hear the *ar* sound at the beginning of the word *art*.

Say the word *art*. What sound do you hear at the beginning? (pause for the student to answer)

That's right! *Ar* makes the *ar* sound.

Say the *ar* sound three times: *ar, ar, ar* (point to the *ar* each time)

You've already learned one sound that *ar* makes. In these words *ar* makes a different sound.

These two letters, *a* and *r*, work together to make the sound *or*.

You hear the *or* sound at the end of the word *war*.

Say the word *war*. What sound do you hear at the end? (pause for the student to answer)

That's right! *AR* makes the *or* sound.

Say the *AR* sound three times: *or, or, or* (point to the *ar* each time)
