Teacher Instructions

Read the words in **bold** out loud to your learner.

(point to *ow*) These letters, *o* and *w*, work together to make the sound *ow*.

You hear the *ow* sound at the end of the word *cow*. Say the *ow* sound three times: *ow, ow, ow*

(point to the *ow* each time)

(point to *ou*) These letters, *o* and *u*, work together to make the sound *ou*.

You hear the *ou* sound at the beginning of the word *out*. Say the *ou* sound three times: *ou, ou, ou*

(point to the *ou* each time)



Sometimes *ou* works together to make the sound *ou* like the sound in the middle of the word *rough*.



Sometimes *ou* works together to make the sound *ou* like the sound in the middle of the word *four*.



Sometimes *ou* works together to make the sound *ou* like the sound in the middle of the word *wound*.



Sometimes *ou* works together to make the sound *ou* like the sound in the middle of the word *doubt*. *Doubt* is a memory word. It has a silent *b*.

(point to *oy*) These letters, *o* and *y*, work together to make the sound *oy*.

You hear the *oy* sound at the end of the word *joy*. Say the *oy* sound three times: *oy, oy, oy* (point to the *oy* each time)

(point to *oi*) These letters, *o* and *i*, work together to make the sound *oi*.

You hear the *oi* sound at the beginning of the word *oil*. Say the *oi* sound three times: *oi, oi, oi*

(point to the *oi* each time)
