### Teacher Instructions

Read the words in **bold** out loud to your learner.

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Sometimes when working together *ue* and *ui* make a similar sound. It's the sound at the end of the word *due* and the sound in the middle of the word *fruit*.

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Practice reading these words. Point to each word as you read it.

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Now we are going to learn another way *u* can sound.

Sometime when there is a silent *e* at the end of a word with an *u* in the middle, the *u* makes the sound of its name *U*, like the first sound in the middle of the word *cube*.

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Practice reading these words. Point to each word as you read it.
