

## Lesson 35

### Teacher Instructions

Read the words in **bold** out loud to your learner.

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Let's look at the word ***all***.

(point to *all*)

This word breaks the rules in two ways.

1. The letter *a* doesn't make its usual sound like in *apple*. Instead, it makes the *ah* sound, like in *awesome*. Say ***all***. (Have the child repeat.)
2. The double *L* is only said once. You don't say *all-l*, just ***all***.

Let's practice:

- Point to the *a* and say *ah*.
- Point to the *ll* and say *l* (only once).
- Now read the whole word: ***all***.

Great job! Now you know a word that breaks the rules!
